English Language Proficiency Level 3 - Developing	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Follow two-step oral directions, one step at a time</li> <li>Respond non-verbally to confirm or deny facts (e.g., thumbs up, thumbs down)</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Make predictions (e.g., "It's sunny today. Tomorrow it might...")</li> <li>Answer explicit questions from stories read aloud (e.g., who, what or where)</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Use pictures to identify words</li> <li>Classify visuals according to labels or icons (e.g., animals v. plants)</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Communicate using letters, symbols and numbers in context</li> <li>Reproduce familiar words from labeled models or illustrations</li> </ul>
